



In 1987 Paolo Tinarelli and Enrico Quinto created their PR studio CREATIVITALIA.

After almost ten years of wide-ranging experience in events promotion in the spheres of cinema, the arts, fashion and politics, in December 1996 they established Rome's first flea market, catering specifically for the private collector and non professionals.

Overnight success produced a chain reaction all over Italy and the "flea market boom" was born.

In recognition of our efforts, the mayor's office in Rome found itself taking steps to legislate in favour of this new phenomenon. This seal of approval, at local government level, was the first in Italy and many other local authorities all over the country followed this precedent.













Soon it became frequented by an elite clientele, amongst which were women who had for years been customers of High Fashion and Pret-a-Porter. Il Mercatino del Borghetto Flaminio became a means by which twentieth century fashion came to be appreciated anew. After ten years, by this process, our private collection grew into one of the main historical costume and fashion archives in Italy.

The market was inspired by a principle of re-use and recycling, which aimed to bring the decorative arts once again to peoples' attention, to celebrate the so-called minor arts and encourage an independence of spirit as regards personal taste, that is one which is unconcerned with whatever happens to be "in" or "out" at a given time.

Our approach led to a general acceptance, an elevation in prestige at international level, of the idea of re-use and re-appreciation now expressed in the generic term "Vintage", which had previously been reserved for cars and wine!

The Enrico Quinto and Paolo Tinarelli collection now numbers more than 6000 pieces, including accessories, supported by a library of many thousands of books, year books, periodicals, catalogues and photographic collections.


This ensemble of material traces the development of female fashion in the twentieth century through pieces from the major creative forces. This is achieved from an international perspective but with a distinctly Italian emphasis.


This resource is not only used by costume historians and students of fashion but also as a source of inspiration to contemporary designers for collections yet to come.



A Century Of Fashion

More than 15,000 visitors came to this exhibition, which took place in Rome at L' Accademia di Francia in Villa Medici in the Autumn/ Winter of 2003-2004.
